



## お風呂 OFURO

Furo are part of the Japanese ritual of bathing and are not used for washing but for relaxing. Washing is carried out separately outside the ofuro, and only when completely clean does the bather enter the water. The water is hot: usually approximately 100 to 108 degrees F (38 to 42 degrees Celsius).

The Tub is made of Inoki wood from Kiso valley and provide natural aromatherapy by its scent.

*\*Note\**: Japanese have no problem bathing together nude, so if you're not comfortable with this, it's probably best to skip the experience. Otherwise, it's definitely worth the time. No one's going to stare at you.



## ETIQUETTE

### \*USING THE OFURO\*

Make sure to clean yourself thoroughly. This includes soap. Make sure to rinse off well before getting into the tub

Do not take a bath with your underwear on

Before enter the tub, rinse your feet using water from the tub

Do not bring your towel with you into the tub



Do not waste water

Enjoy the Ofuro quietly
